WHAT IS CLUB KEIKI

“Keiki” means “children” in Hawaiian. Club Keiki is a program for ages 6–18 years old (elementary, junior high, and high School students). This program is limited to spring, summer, and winter.

The Club Keiki program provides students with the opportunity to engage in Hawaiian culture-related activities, then attend English classes in the afternoon that improve their communicative skills. Since the English curriculum is tied to the activity content, students can deepen their understanding of English, Hawaii, and American culture!



3 REASONS TO CHOOSE CLUB KEIKI

There are many types of activities that allow your children to learn English in a natural environment.

We have fun activities such as mini golf, ice skating, and fishing. We also have vocational activities such as working experiences and farming experiences in the U.S. along with science and art activities. Since the English curriculum is tied to the content of the activity, students can deepen their understanding of English, Hawaii, and American culture!

We respect and encourage the individuality of every student's learning style.

Children can improve their communication skills and develop a willingness to learn by spending time with other children of different national origins and ages. They will also learn to be more considerate towards their classmates.

Instructors and activity leaders provide hands-on guidance to students.

CPC is a very tight-knit community. We have a close and friendly relationship with our instructors and activity leaders. When children become more confident, they will be better able to express themselves by the time they finish the program.



HOW OLD ARE YOU?

We group students by age and level.

In order to enhance learning, we separate students first by age, then by level. By grouping students with those of similar age, we can offer programs and activities that best match their development and interests.

Then by further separating by level this ensures that their English needs are met. This makes learning comfortable, fosters bonds with classmates and most importantly opens the idea that learning English is fun!

Our young learners will begin their journey with a placement test. This placement test will help sort students in the right class for them that will help to nurture and build their confidence and skills with the English language. Following this they will have a short orientation where they will go over important information while also getting to know other students. This duo of tasks will kickstart their experience during Club Keiki, opening doors to new possibilities.



The Kids' Level (6 - 12 Years Old)

At this level, our goal is to build a foundation for the student's English communication skills. They will focus on listening and speaking as well as some grammar and vocabulary that will aid in practical English and functional day-to-day English.

This lays the groundwork for children to be confident with their communication abilities.

Abilities and tools they can use for international settings and during overseas travel.



The Teens' Level (13 - 18 Years Old)

At this level, students have likely built a foundation with their skills. So, our goal is to further empower and continue their growth. We work at tailoring and fine tuning the tools they already possess. This level will go beyond grammar, vocabulary and writing. The focus will then turn to more complex points that they can still use in daily life and their futures. More native like and natural pronunciation, idioms, expressions, discussion and some academic/professional features will be their guide. All of which will stimulate students and prepare them for the real-world ahead of them.

Our English Class Level

All instructors are native speakers with qualifications in English education, specifically chosen for their expertise in teaching Young Learners.

Students take a placement test on the first day of school, and the results determine their class level. The levels are determined with a particular emphasis on each individual's speaking ability.

This package includes: Registration fees for one parent and one child, Program fees for one parent and one child, housing placement fee, housing rent fee (Including 2 meals per day for homestay; no meals included for condominium), airport pick up and drop off (round trip), and taxes. This package does not include: Flight fees, living costs, overseas insurance, optional photo fee and textbooks for the parent.

- ※ An additional 5% will be charged for any student over the age of 55.

TEEN STUDENT PACKAGE

This package is designed for students aged 13 to 18 traveling alone. It includes round-trip airport transfers, homestay accommodation, three meals a day, and program fees, providing a comprehensive and cost-effective option for first-time solo travelers. Additionally, there is an option to include transfers from the homestay to the school.

*We accept students under the age of 12 for solo travel under certain conditions. Please contact the school for more details.

THE TEEN PACKAGE SAFETY POINTS

- Dedicated staff airport pickup
We will connect with the student in advance via LINE or other communication platforms to ensure we can meet them at the airport on the day of arrival.
- Safe and reliable homestay
Our homestay coordinator will introduce a trustworthy family, carefully selected in advance.
- Transportation between homestay and school
The host family will provide daily transportation to and from the school. There's no need to use public transportation, adding an extra layer of security.

WHAT'S INCLUDED IN THE PACKAGE

Program registration fee, program costs, accommodation arrangement fee, homestay (single room with two meals per day), weekend lunch, round-trip airport transfers, and taxes.

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED IN THE PACKAGE

Airfare, living expenses, overseas insurance, optional photo fees, and optional transportation fees between the homestay and school.

FAQ

Q1. Can parents participate in the program with their children?

A1. Club Keiki is for kids only. Although parents are not allowed to participate in the Club Keiki program with their children, we do offer a Short Term English Program (STEP) for adult learners.

Q2. Can my child participate in the program alone?

A2. ① If your child is leaving your country and coming to Hawaii alone in the United States, it is illegal for children under the age of 12 to travel alone. It is considered negligence and is punishable by law.

If you plan to have your child travel to the United States without your supervision, you will need to have another guardian (who is presently staying in the United States) accompany your child on the plane ride entering the United States.

※ If you have applied for your child to do a homestay, a homestay family member may act as a guardian to your child.

② Travelling to Hawaii together as a family solely for my child to participate in the program

That is no problem at all. However, because the children will meet at our school and be dismissed from the school for the program your child must be dropped off at and picked up from school by a guardian.

Q3. Would my child be allowed to join in the middle of the program?

A3. The program runs from Monday to Friday but your child may join in the middle of the week and finish in the middle of the week. However, please be aware that no refund will be given for the cost of those days missed. In the same way that your child is allowed to leave early, if they are late and miss the bus they may still join lunch and the afternoon English class.

Q4. What will happen on the first day of the program?

A4. On the first day of the program (Monday) at 8:00 am please come to the front desk of Suite 1705 in the building where our school is located. From 8:15 am, there will be an approximately 15 minute orientation about the program parents and guardians must attend. After the orientation, you will take your child to the ground floor and see them off before they board the school bus and depart. (It is up to you if you want to see them your child off). ※If your child is joining in the middle of the program, you will do the orientation at another time on your own.

Q5. What should my child bring?

A5. Please have your child bring a water bottle (a large bottle is highly recommended), a hat, athletic shoes, sunscreen, bug spray, an umbrella and/or rain coat, and writing utensils. (We will prepare classroom materials at school). The things they will need to bring will vary day to day, so please be sure to reference the activity schedule on what to bring everyday.

Q6. How many children will be in each class? How will they be assigned to their classes?

A6. There are about 8 children in each class on average for the afternoon English classes. Their level assignments will be based not on age but their individual English abilities. (Every year we have children with various levels of English, from those studying English for the first time to those who are born and raised in Hawaii).

Now, we determine their levels by their giving parents surveys asking about their children's English abilities and simple speaking tests administered in person.

Q7. Will it be a problem if my child does not know any English?

A7. Don't worry. We can accommodate your child even if they know zero English (e.g. if they are only starting to learn the alphabet).

Q8. My child goes to an international school and is confident in their English abilities so would they be allowed to attend an adult class instead?

A8. If the instructor decides your child's level of English is suitable for the adult class, your child may be moved to the adult class provided that they are okay with the following:

① The afternoon adult class is from 1:00 pm to 4:50 pm. Your child will be moved from the kids' program English classes that are from 1:15pm to 3:45 pm.

② The regular students in the adult class will all be older than your child.

③ Classes at this school are based on student participation so your child should be willing to participate on their own.

If your child is willing to abide by these 3 conditions, this arrangement should be fine. If you want to make this arrangement, please let us know in advance (at latest before the orientation on the first day of the program).

Q9. How do we get from our hotel to the school?

A9. You may come by bus, on foot, or by car (Uber). The school is directly connected to Ala Moana Shopping Center and a 15 minute walk from the Ilikai Marina in Waikiki and Discovery bay. If you are taking the bus, there is a chance the bus may not arrive on time and there may be traffic. Therefore, we also recommend walking to school in the morning. CPC's condominium residences (share homes) are 5 - 15 minute walk from the school. ※Please refer to CPC Parent and Child Study Abroad Plan on the previous page

Q10. Is there a parking lot?

A10. There is a parking lot located in our building. You must pay to park in the building or you can park nearby.

Q11. What kind of food do the kids get for lunch?

A11. The kids have really liked stuff like stir-fry beef bentos, kara age bentos, and pizza that we have given them every year.
